MQA Will Be Required Yearly For ALL 4-H & FFA Market Livestock Members!!

MQA Training along with the New Feed Directive Training will be on February 19th @ 1:00 P.M. at the Saddle Club Building. (*The previous rule was that first year members attend the class and they were to attend again when they turned 14*). Please note that ALL 4-H & FFA Market Livestock participants will be required to attend a MQA CLASS EVERY YEAR that they are enrolled in a market livestock project from 2017 forward!

BREEDING BEEF: Would you be interested in a Prospect Heifer class at our County Fair? If so, contact us at the Extension Office and let us know that you are interested. Remember, the deadline to Add this project is May 1st, 2017, However, you will want your heifer before this date.

PAST CAMP RECOUNTS & EXPERIENCES: National 4-H Congress – Katlyn went to Atlanta! Congratulations to Katlyn Freeburg for her opportunity to attend this event. She won the Grand Champion 4-H Wildlife project at the State Fair which earned her this chance. Please read Katlyn's recount on her National Congress Trip below:

Hello my name is Katlyn Freeburg, I am 19 years old and a freshman at Colorado State University Pueblo. I was a 13 year 4-H member and during those 13 years I completed 77 projects and attended countless camps. Over Thanksgiving break I attended the most memorable and helpful conference of my 4-H career, The National 4-H Congress. 15 delegates from the state of Colorado joined almost a thousand other 4-H members from 39 states and one territory, in Atlanta, Georgia.

On the 25th, the Colorado delegation headed to DIA to begin our five day adventure. Upon arrival in Atlanta, we checked into our rooms and headed to the "get acquainted dinner" where we stuck together but met a few people from other states. Kevin Wanzer, the opening assembly's speaker, showed us that there is joy in everyday activities. The day ended with games that allowed us to meet many more people.

Day two began with our morning speaker, Barbara Chamberlin, who spoke to us about how words are the most powerful thing in the world. The way we use them could be the difference in getting a job or not. The rest of the day was filled with workshops which included, speed meeting, The Power of Service Learning, Coolness of Science, and many more. That night the ballroom was transformed into a trip around the world, there were decorated serving stations representing different regions of the world including Egypt, China, and America. The evening ended with great food, entertainment from the Hawaiian and Puerto Rico delegations, and a dance to follow.

Day three, the most inspiring day, started with the presentation of the state flags. Our speaker for the morning was Dr. Eugen Schoenfeld, a survivor of the Holocaust, delivered the most important message of the congress, hope will carry you through even the toughest times. After the assembly, the states went their separate ways and enjoyed a meal outside of the hotel. The Colorado delegation walked a few blocks to Pittypat's Southern Diner, the building which the restaurant calls home is featured in the popular movie "Gone With the Wind". After some more workshops, we headed to the Atlanta History Center for an evening of culture and dinner.

In 4-H giving back to the community is a big part of the program, so on the 28th we did just that. Two groups headed outdoors to pick up trash or pull invasive plants, while the rest of the groups traveled to local elementary schools and assisted the teachers in the classroom. After a long couple of days it was time to explore the city. The delegation split and headed to the aquarium, zoo, Coca Cola factory, or the Football Hall of Fame. After an afternoon on the town, it was time to get dressed up and go to the Congress Gala. The speakers concluding the night included Miss America 2017 and Sam Pardue, who told us to follow our dreams and never give up on them even when something may stand in the way.

The following morning closed with Dan Clark speaking about how we should live every day to the fullest. With that brought the goodbye to many amazing friends I had made throughout the week. I had made some great friends from Wisconsin, Louisiana, Pennsylvania, and Colorado. 4-H allowed me to meet other people who had the same interests as I do and become friends with them. This is one of the many reasons I believe 4-H is the most powerful youth program in the nation.

The trip to Atlanta opened my eyes to all of the opportunities that 4-H has to offer and how many people love the program just as much as I do. I would encourage all of our current 4-H members to take at least one of the qualifying projects to have a chance at going on this trip. The National 4-H Congress was the perfect way to finish my 4-H career.

<u>Colorado 4-H is excited to announce our Community Service Project for LDC and</u> <u>Youth Fest!</u>

We have teamed up with Funds2Orgs to not only raise a little money to support our state events, but with your donation of gently worn shoes, you will be helping to develop and sustain micro-businesses in more than 25 under-developed nations around the world.

Families in these nations that receive the shoes that you collect have little to no income or livelihood. These shoes, and their ability to be sold or repurposed, represent a micro-enterprise opportunity for individual families and their communities. It represents true sustainability.

GOAL: 300 bags of 25 pairs of shoes in each bag by mid-February 2017.

We are challenging each county to bring a minimum of 2 bags of 25 pairs of shoes to LDC and 1 bag of 25 pairs of shoes to Youth Fest. Western National Roundup is also contributing to this service project so between the three events, we should reach our goal. Shoes need to be rubber banded together and placed in clear plastic bags. PLEASE, shoes are to be new, or gently worn and clean. If you would not lend the shoes to your best friend, then they are not good enough for this donation.

You can collect shoes from your family, friends, neighbors, and anyone you know. It is estimated that around 600 million pairs of shoes go into America's landfills and a majority of these shoes can still be worn. I know I have four pair of shoes that are for sure getting donated. They can be heels, flats, tennis shoes, dress shoes, boots, work boots, any shoes. Just as long as they are clean and in good shape.
