4-H Enrollment —Enrollment materials will soon be available and placed on the website when we get them. Families are highly encouraged to complete enrollments through 4HOnline. All 4-H members must complete the 4-H enrollment form by the deadline of December 1st. (This is for re-enrollment of previous members)

New member enrollment deadline is March 1, 2018

The county enrollment fee is \$25 per member. This fee needs to be paid by the deadline as well unless you have talked to the Extension Office for an extension or to apply for a scholarship. The literature fees will be based on your actual manuals, record books, etc. that are ordered for any of the projects.

Please note that ALL 4-H Market Livestock participants will be required to attend a MQA EVERY YEAR that they are enrolled in a market livestock project from here on out. We will keep you posted with the actual dates that the MQA trailer will be coming.

Market Animal Feed Directive Information

• Please read the information about the upcoming rule changes regarding the use of antibiotics in market animals as provided by your Colorado 4-H Livestock Task Force. This information pertains to all market animals. Additionally, this informative handout contains information that you can share as well. Youth Loans

The Farm Service Agency makes loans to youth to establish and operate agricultural income-producing projects in connection with 4-H clubs, FFA and other agricultural groups. Projects must be planned and operated with the help of the organization advisor, produce sufficient income to repay the loan and provide the youth with practical business and educational experience. The maximum loan amount is \$5000.

Youth Loan Eligibility Requirements:

- Be a citizen of the United States (which includes Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands) or a legal resident alien
- Be 10 years to 20 years of age
- Comply with FSA's general eligibility requirements
- Be unable to get a loan from other sources
- Conduct a modest income-producing project in a supervised program of work as outlined above
- Demonstrate capability of planning, managing and operating the project under guidance and assistance from a
 project advisor. The project supervisor must recommend the youth loan applicant, along with providing adequate
 supervision.

January 26-29,2017 – Leadership Development Camp



The following January, they sell their calves & recieve the proceeds in hopes to continue with more projects within the beef cattle industry.
