Michael T. "Mickey" Hunt was selected to be the Deputy Executive Director of the Colorado Department of Military and Veterans Affairs in October, 2009.

Prior to this selection he was the Resource Director and Legislative Liaison for the Department. The Colorado Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMVA) is an executive agency of the State of Colorado. The DMVA is the overarching organization which controls the following entities:

• **Colorado National Guard (CONG)** - The militia of the State of Colorado. The Commander in Chief of the CONG is Governor Hickenlooper.

- **Division of Veterans Affairs** The DVA provides veteran's services to the citizens of Colorado and trains the County Veterans Service Officers.
- Colorado Wing of the Civil Air Patrol This 2100+ volunteer organization is the auxiliary of the United States Air Force.
