**NEW/OLD BUSINESS**

Commissioner Attebery gave some background information regarding the problems with AT&T service in Custer County and the problems with 911 in the last week. He stated that a letter was sent from the BOCC to the President of AT&T in October 2015.

Commissioner Kattnig stated that he has been in contact with the Director of External Affairs, Jennifer Price. She was originally scheduled to come to this meeting but now will have to join the meeting via conference call.

Responding to a question from the audience, Commissioner Shy gave some information regarding the T-Mobile tower that is in Custer County.

Assistant County Attorney, Clint Smith, has been in contact with an attorney for AT&T, Kathy Swaller. She would like to have a 911 specialist from AT&T come up and do some testing.

AT&T Director of External Affairs, Jennifer Price, and Principal Technical Consulting Engineer, Ken Malm joined the meeting via conference call and spoke about testing and analysis that AT&T has been conducting since the outage on June 2, 2016.

County Sheriff, Shannon Byerly, commented that 911 cell service has been out for a total of five days, not just the one day that AT&T has spoken of.

Commissioner Attebery ended the call with Jennifer Price and Ken Molder.

**MOTION by Commissioner Attebery, seconded by Commissioner Kattnig, to amend the BOCC meeting schedule to include a meeting to be held on June 17, 2016 at 1:00 PM to continue the AT&T discussion. Motion carried unanimously.**
