

Custer Emergency Services Meeting Notes
Tuesday, May 15th- 2pm to 4pm

1. Announcements
 - a. Lisa Drew announce as new executive director for the clinic.
2. Credentialing Updates
 - a. Salamander Photo_Roster (notebook) can be used to scan personnel into incident, and on-scene.
 - b. OEM updated the Track App, the five licenses are now generic and anyone can sign in, making the process easier.
3. HS Updates
 - a. SO security fence project has tentative approval, should finalize in June.
 - b. No other Custer County projects approved at this time.
4. Tower IGA
 - i. No action, pending new clinic director.
 - ii. BoCC to discuss at their meeting and advise further direction.
5. CES/LEPC Meeting Notes on County Website—discussion/input for BOCC
 - a. All 12 monthly meeting aren't HAZMAT related, so we combine them and also do trainings.
 - b. Consensus of the council is to publish council notes and rosters.
6. After Action Review (AARs): talk about some issues on the local level
 - a. AVSAR mutual aid 5/1
 - i. 5 agencies – SAGMAC worked well for comms.
 - ii. Issues converting 3 coordinate systems, as some agencies had difficulty switching to the requested format.
 - b. Fremont Structure Fire 5/7
 - i. Public doesn't realize Sheriff as Fire Marshall does not have responsibility for structure fires in unincorporated areas.
 - ii. Structure fires have potential to become wildland fires.
 - iii. Discussion to continue at Fremont County Fire Chiefs meeting.
 - c. SAR/EMS mission 5/14
 - i. Multi-agencies should move to Custer MAC.
 - ii. Tactical/Ops communications should then move their traffic to other channels. (non-repeated preferred, where possible)
 - iii. Confusion to who was IC and/or Site Command.
 - d. Other General Feedback
 - i. All agencies send Dispatch your rosters. Rosters should be shared among agencies.
 - ii. All county response vehicles, incl. R&B need county maps book in vehicles.
 - iii. Avenza maps is a great resource for mapping and knowing locations.
 - iv. If requesting a STATE MAC channel, it must go through dispatch.

- v. USE Fire 1 as a HAIL CHANNEL, if dispatch isn't copying your traffic on your local channel (all agencies).

7. Reports:

- a. HAZMAT TEP Planning Committee
 - i. TTX will be on August 21st
- b. Dispatch
 - i. The contract has been signed for the new systems. The installation will be done in September and it is a two-week process. The transfer will have to be transfer to FRCOM for 4-6 hours.
 - ii. CodeRed contract through 3/18/19. 3yr auto renewal if not cancelled in advance. April all-call test 60% success rate. If Century Link switching is an issue, ask tech support about reducing the launch speed. Issues likely regardless of switching vendors. Follow-up action required if new vendor is desired.
- c. Solvista--Lipka
 - i. Encourage more stakeholders to attend the Health Care Collation. Meetings are the 2nd Tuesday, 9:30-1:30 in Pueblo
- d. PH—Magnuson
 - i. Getting ready for the Camp 101 information
- e. MRC
 - i. Need to get new logo for the MRC for credentialing
 - 1. [Logos should be no greater than 400 x 400 pixels and cannot exceed 4MB]
 - ii. Not all personnel have photos
- f. CERT-- Sage
 - i. List has been given to OEM of the most recent CERT class
 - ii. Will follow up on the students who have done 100 and 700
 - iii. Need credentialed – (setup P. Sage admin on CERT; OEM to print)
- g. WMFPD-Shy
 - i. Working on locating water sources, getting GPS location. Will combine that with LZ and Dip points.
 - ii. The collection of bonfire wood is being stopped at the school.
 - iii. Fireworks: WMFPD will order the fireworks but will not store them. Undetermined if conditions will allow fireworks display this year; Otherwise vendor will store for 2019.
 - iv. BLM is planning on being Stage 1 in the “very near future” in Custer and surrounding counties.
 - v. Talked with FMO LoBiondo, in part about electric fences posing a fire threat:
 - 1. Make sure fences are not sagging or on the ground
 - 2. And that all the insulators are in place
 - vi. Still struggling with “No Man’s Land”
 - 1. Oak Creek Grade area
 - 2. EMS has this same problem

- h. WMVFD—
 - i. Mutual Aid with Red Creek in place
 - ii. Tactical Tender back in service but searching for a new one
 - iii. Credentials are done
- i. EMS
 - i. Flight for Life training on the 20th
 - 1. EMT Basic class within the next month or so; Working out the cost with PCC
- j. GIS/IT
 - i. Reconfigured maps in dispatch
 - ii. Printing out map books of the county for first responders
- k. R&B
 - i. The front axle on the water trucks were underrated
 - ii. Three new water trucks coming
- l. Other
 - i. Custer is part of the “drought task force” activated from the Governor, right now only on the ag portion.
 - ii. USDA Designated Seven Counties in Colorado as Primary Natural Disaster Areas; Custer Farmers and ranchers are located in contiguous counties and also qualify for natural disaster assistance.
 - iii. How will economic impact be measured in Custer County?
- m. State Patrol
 - i. Not at full state, they are less than half staffed then what they should be
 - ii. Actively recruiting people, especially from Custer County
 - iii. If there is an incident that needs State Patrol, they will be respond
- n. SO
 - i. Looking at school resource officer options, but the funding isn’t there for that program. If there would be a program, that school would have to give at least 40%, somewhere in that.
 - 1. There are different Grants out there to help, COPS grant
- o. SAR
 - i. Working off donations and grants
 - ii. A donation was sent in from SAR for \$15,000
 - iii. SAR has new pickup, working to completely outfit
 - iv. Changed the SAR barn locks
 - v. Working on contract with medical director
- p. Tom Flower
 - i. The Health and Safety Response Team/Hazard Team
 - 1. Trying to get a represented from agencies to know how and who to respond (SO, EMS, BH, PH, Planning & Zoning etc.)
 - 2. Next meeting is tomorrow, May 16 at 2
